DEATH OF DR. DASHWOOD-HOWARD

The many Norfolk friends of Dr. A. Dashwood-Howard will regret to hear of his death, which occurred, after a comparatively brief illness, yesterday at his Ludham residence, the Mowle. For some years before the war he spent his vacations in Ludham village, afterwards acquiring an old-fashioned house on the west meadowland of Womack Broad, where he busied himself in homestead occupations, with occasional breaks at his residence near London. During the war he served with the Royal Army Medical Corps, holding the rank of Captain. The British Legion had in him an enthusiastic supporter. He was an expert photographer, producing the illustrations to Ludham Church guide book, besides numerous snapshots of the characteristics of local sports. Much sympathy is felt in the neighbourhood for his wife, son, who is a naval cadet, and two young daughters.
